

Police Officer II, Airport Police Division – LAWA, for Leadership; Mario Morales, Security Badge Office, Airport Police Division – LAWA, for Customer Service: Mary Lou Newborn. Senior Clerk Typist - ONT, for Public Service; and Alfred **Tong**, Environmental Specialist III – Environmental Services Division – LAWA, for Collaboration.

Officer Montes, nominated by Lieutenant Robert Rios, Training and Recruitment Unit, was cited for his excellence in leadership. "He demonstrates leadership through his commitment to training and education as the initiator and founder of the LAWA Wellness and Fitness Programs," Rios said. "Montes' dedication to health promotes healthy living, creating a healthier, happier and more productive work force."

Morales, nominated by Senior Management Analyst II Glen Cabrera, was cited for "demonstrating exemplary commitment to

customer service. He implanted several improvements in the Security Badge Office that included adjusting and increasing operational hours and overseeing the new automated queue management system."

Newborn, security background specialist in the LA/Ontario Badge Office, was nominated by Management Analyst I Stan Rogers. Newborn was credited with "playing an integral role in maintaining security and uninterrupted operations," Rogers said. "She inspires others through her positive impact on aviation security ... Mary Lou's work ethic is passionate, unmatched, and inspiring."

Tong, nominated by Environmental Affairs Officer Carolyn Lin, was described as being respected by his co-workers for his teamwork and reliability. "He has worked with the city's Department of Water and Power to successfully apply for and win grants for the electric vehicle (EV) chargers from the South Coast Air Quality Management District and the California Energy Commission," she said. "(He) exhibits a strong sense of teamwork while working towards operational savings and customer satisfaction. His work aids LAWA in its goal to be a 'green' airport."

Ethel Pattison will be honored for nearly 60 years of service to aviation education with the fourth annual Guiding Light award from the Flight Path Museum and Learning Center at LAX. The award will be presented at Flight Path's 18th annual Gala fundraiser on October 1 in the Proud Bird Restaurant, 11022 Aviation Blvd.

Since beginning her LAX career in 1956, Pattison has served as chief airport guide, heading airport educational tours; as airport information specialist and historian, assisting students and other researchers; and as a board member and as operations chair of Flight Path, overseeing exhibits, library service and audiovisual productions.

In recognition of Pattison's contributions to LAX and aviation, the Los Angeles Board of Airport Commissioners named the rose garden adjacent to the LAX's Clifton A. Moore Administration Building in her honor. She was presented the prestigious City of Los Angeles Career Service Award in 1991.

Born in Los Angeles, Pattison grew up in Hollywood and was graduated from John Marshall High School and the University of Southern California. She is a former United Airlines flight attendant.
