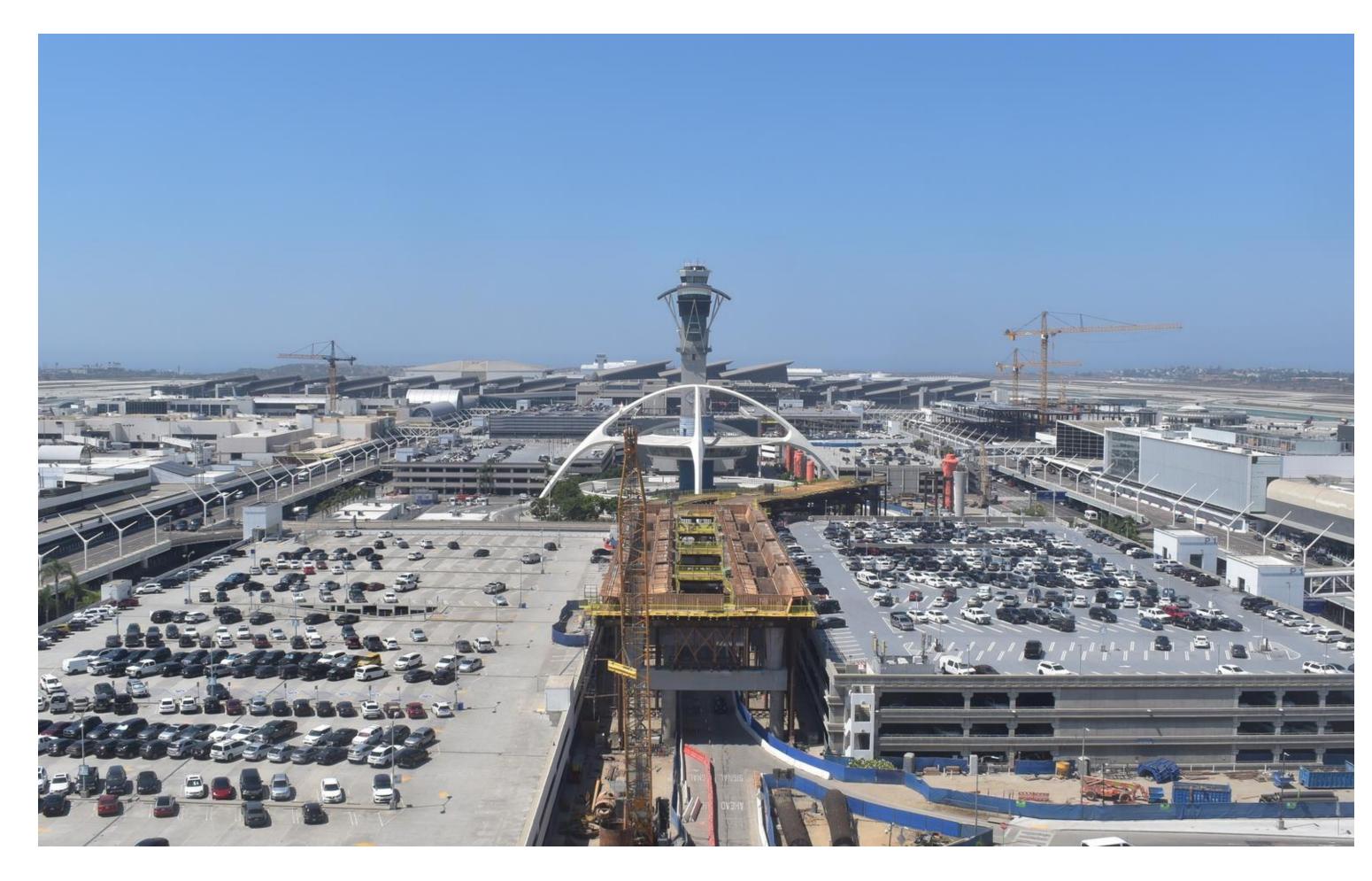
Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Program Status Update

October 1, 2020



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CIP Overview

- Reflects LAWA's Strategic and Capital Priorities and how they will be addressed
- Finalized in 2018, defining a baseline program of 94 projects and \$14.29B budget
- Made up of projects that specifically advance one or more of LAWA's Capital Priorities
- Grouped into six CIP Delivery Programs of related projects for project management, governance, and reporting. These Programs are:
 - Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP)
 - Terminal Development & Improvement Program (TDIP)
 - Airports Development Program (ADP)
 - Facility Maintenance Program (FMP)
 - Midfield Satellite Concourse (MSC) Program
 - Security & Technology Enhancement Program (STEP)



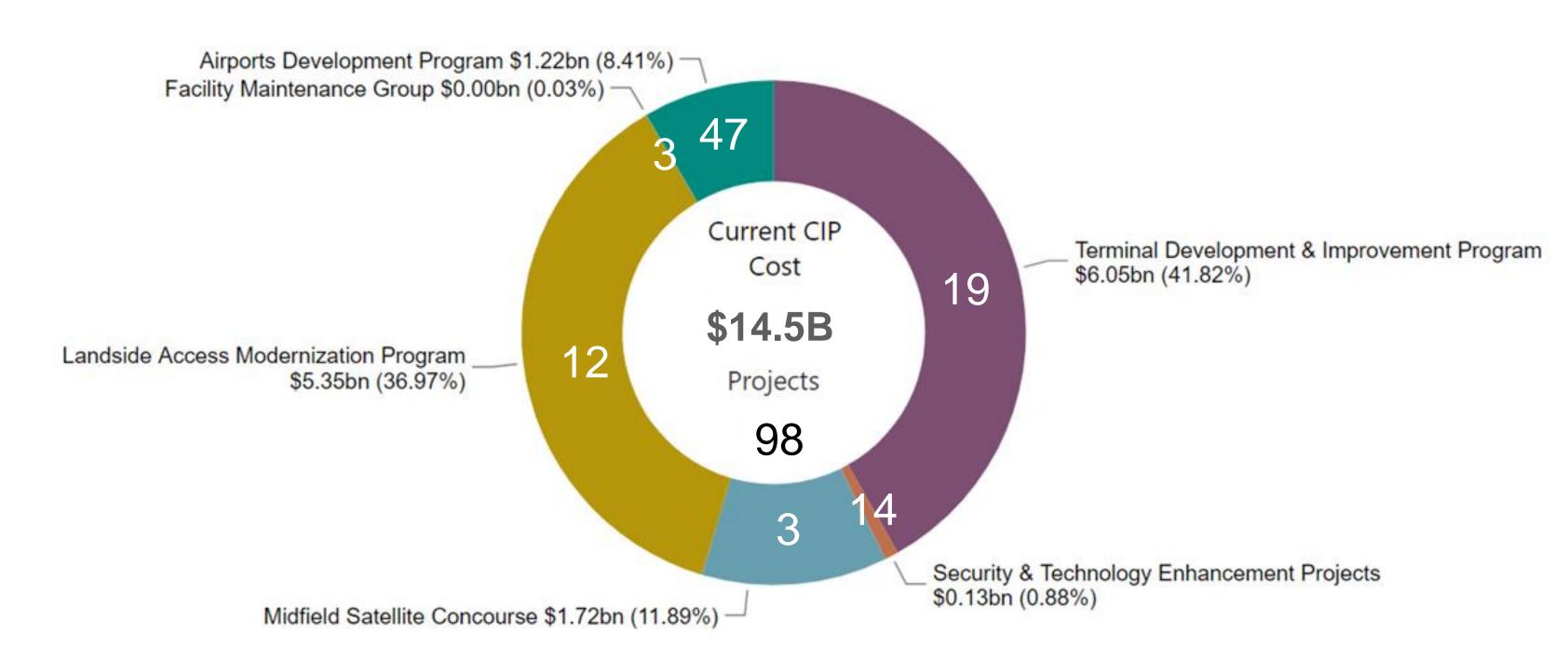


Terminal 1.5 Project

CIP Current Status (as of 6/30/2020)

The CIP Current Status represents the Program budget as of June 30, 2020. \$14.5B budget breaks down as follows:

- Hard Costs¹ \$12.8B (89%)
- Soft Costs² \$1.2B (8%)
- Contingency³– \$560M budgeted,
 \$420M remaining (3%)



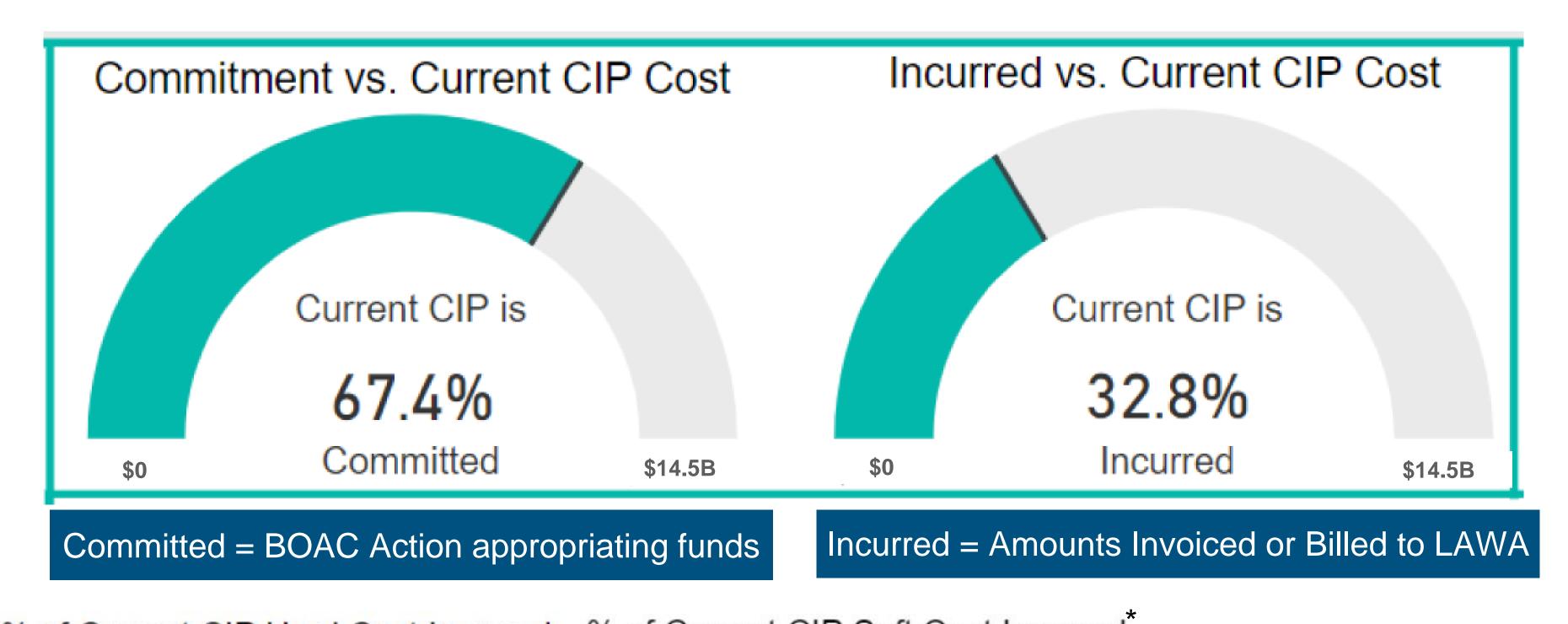
CIP by Delivery Program

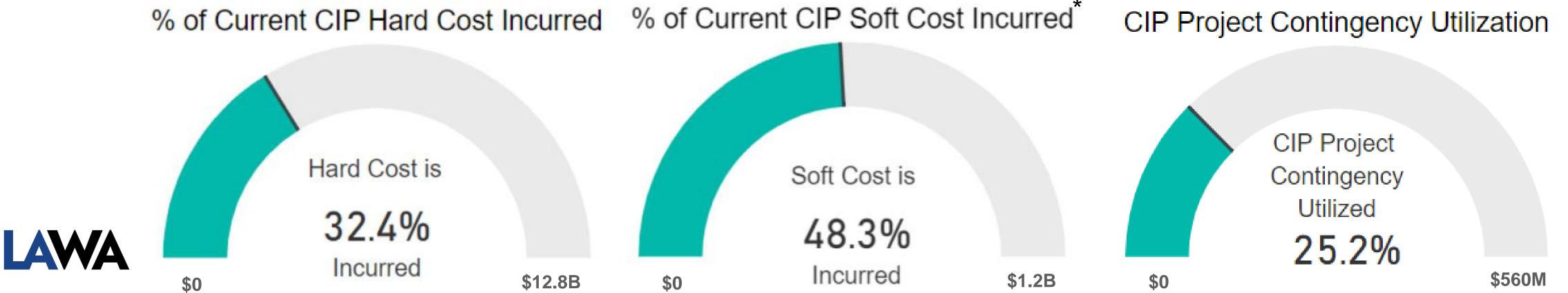

^{*}Several categories of soft costs occur prior to construction, including planning, environmental, procurement, and estimation.

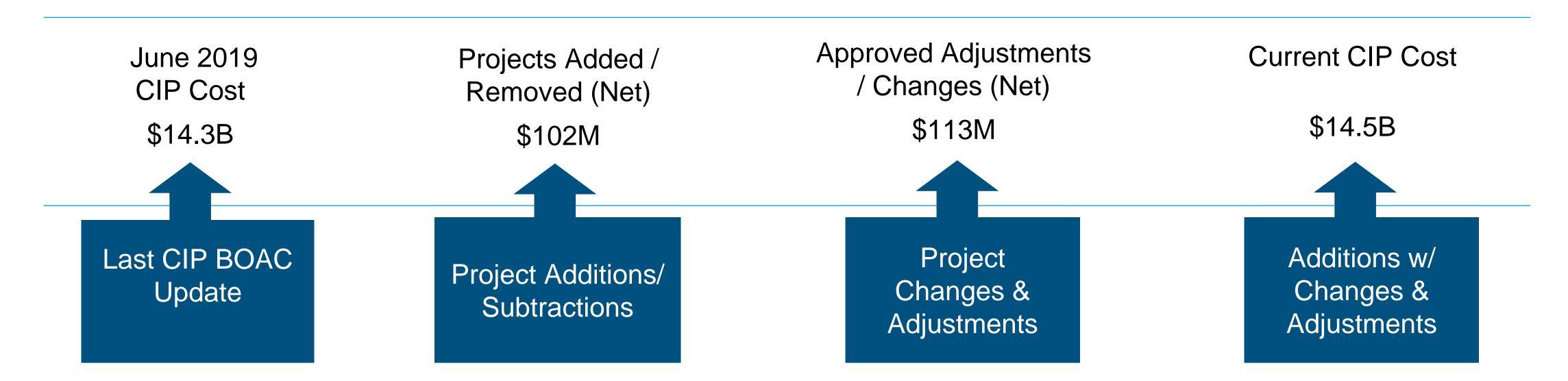
Current Construction Schedule – Awarded Projects

In just the 2nd year of the CIP, LAWA has already progressed through approximately one-third of the currently budgeted construction program. It is projected we will be at the halfway point in 2021, and two-thirds in 2022.





Changes & Adjustments (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020)



Adjustments to the CIP since the end of FY2019 include:

- \$102M for thirteen new projects added to the CIP.
- \$113M in net changes to projects already in the CIP, which includes:
 - \$142.2M in increased budget for projects primarily due to the addition of new scope, and/or cost increases realized in the bidding environment.
 - (\$29.3M) total budget reduction for projects in close out or closed.



CIP Project Changes & Additions

Since 6/30/2019, LAWA has made a number adjustments to the CIP, including project additions, changes, and completion. The following examples highlight the types of changes that have occurred during that time period.

 In addition to these Bi-Annual Reports, LAWA will be bringing CIP Program updates to the BOAC on a quarterly basis
